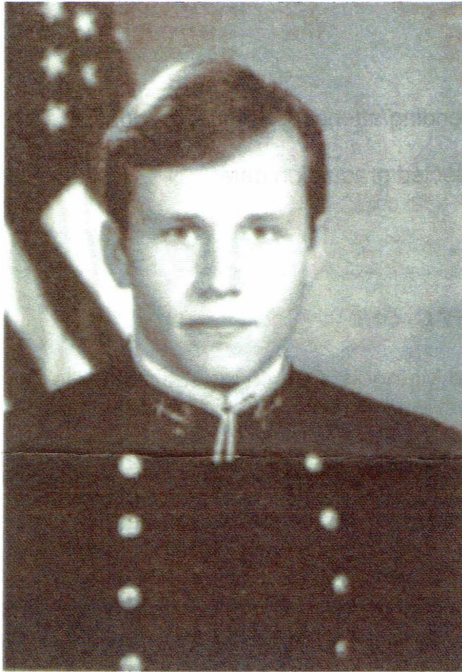


Jeffrey C. Ohl Scholarship

Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church



The JEFFREY C. OHL SCHOLARSHIP is a special program for the college age young adults of Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church. It is a recognition of the high ideals exemplified by Jeff's life, and provides financial aid to help further advance the academic or vocational education of the scholarship recipient.

The applicant must be a member or active participant at Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church, and a high school graduate or graduating senior. The applicant must submit an application, a recent photograph, and a hand written letter describing his or her areas of interest, extra curricular activities, grade point average, community involvement, significant accomplishments, and financial need, and a letter of personal reference or recommendation from the senior pastor.

The application letter should be submitted to the senior pastor at Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church, 513 10th Street, Huntington, WV 25701 by March 31.

The scholarship committee of the Board of Trustees will review the applications, and may call for personal interviews of applicants. The announcement of the award will be made by the end of April. The scholarship is for one academic year, but recipients are eligible to reapply for subsequent years.

A plaque on the first floor of the church lists all previous recipients of the Jeffrey Ohl Scholarship, which was first awarded for the 1984-1985 school year.

ABOUT JEFFREY C. OHL

Jeff was a member of Johnson Memorial United Methodist Church his entire life. He was born February 22, 1960, in Huntington, West Virginia, son of David and Mary Lou Ohl. He has an older brother, Matthew, and younger sister, Jennifer. He was active in Sunday School, the Youth Fellowship and Youth Choirs.

Jeff was an outstanding student and a recognized leader among his peers. He graduated from Huntington East High School in 1978 where he was class Salutatorian, Senior Class President, and a three year member of the football team. He was a graduate of the United States Naval Academy, where he was the 33rd Company Commander.

Following graduation he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps. On June 12, 1982, he married Robin Lynn Weed, a member of Highlawn United Methodist Church. Jeff completed flight training at Whiting Field near Pensacola, Florida.

Jeff died September 23, 1983 in a military aircraft training crash.
